

#### **Junior Class News**

This week we have been extending our understanding of multiplication to introduce the concept of multiplying using repeated addition. This will allow us to apply our knowledge of skip counting, which is growing every day.

Over the next few weeks we will be listening to many of these books on Storybox Library, completing activities to enhance our understanding and then writing book reviews on our favourites. It will be great to see which books are the winners in each category when they are announced on Friday. We will also be getting the shortlisted books in our school library over the coming weeks!

#### **Senior Class News**

Well done to everyone for engaging in their learning and adapting to the busy weeks we have been having. Skiers have been enjoying skiing and non-skiers have been busy helping with KIDO sport on a Tuesday morning and letter of the week with the kinder children on a Tuesday afternoon. Non-skiers have been busy designing an obstacle course for KIDO Sport next week, keeping in mind the age of the participants.

We have been working on our multiplication strategies and building these skills through the use of different maths resources such as cards and dice. These open ended activities have allowed tasks to be differentiated and suitable for a range of learners.

We have been continuing to work on our Wild at Art written pieces and have been refining these to ensure we stay in the allocated word count but also include some great detail. This has been a challenge but students have persisted and are creating some fantastic pieces!

Homework - Students are expected to be reading for a minimum of 20 minutes each evening and writing this in their reading log. A reminder that homework is **due Monday 21st August.** It is lovely to hear students discussing their family trees!

Science - Students have begun creating their designs for our egg experiment, we have one more session to finish these and then we will test our design.
