Junior Class News

In the Junior Room this week we are finalising setting up our reading and writing communities. Thank goodness, now we can get into our actual workshops.

This is perfect timing as last night our teaching staff commenced our first 'teaching sprint', in which we will focus on the introduction of the reading session. Next week we will begin shared reading where the whole class reads aloud from the same big book each day. This assists with fluency and phrasing, vocabulary and reading strategies.

Each Tuesday morning Liz will take the class for maths, with a focus this term on graphing. This allows me time to do some work in my Mental Health and Wellbeing Leader role. We are continuing our work in place value for the reminder of the term in maths for the other days.

On Monday we will commence our M100W program with students being provided a series of words to learn to read or spell, which will be tested every Monday. The words, and sometimes some extra sets for games, will be in your child's Take Home Book bag. Thanks to those families who have remembered to bring take home and library books each week, some students have nearly reached the first milestone of 25 nights!




