



School Information

Mental Health in Primary Schools

I am excited to be continuing in the MHiPS role at Omeo Primary this year and some of the work myself and Ashleigh put in last year is coming to fruition in an exciting time for our school community. We have already recommenced our speech session with Melissa Johnston, and have booked in sessions with psychologist Lauren Short when she returns from leave in March. These services are both school funded.

We have managed to secure the services of Sasha Wood, who is a Child Mental Health Clinician from the Royal Flying Doctor service. Sasha will be visiting Omeo in person once a fortnight commencing later this term to provide mental health and wellbeing support to our students. I will be contacting some families to offer children a place with Sasha over the coming week. Families who would like support for their child are also welcome to contact the team directly on wellbeing@rfdsvic.com.au by or phoning 1800 001 068 to commence the intake process.

Furthermore, we have recently been offered counselling for children and families by Kerrilee Kimber from Connect Me, which is a division of Relationships Australia. Please see the poster attached to see what Kerrilee can offer your child. The referral form is also attached.
