ATTENDANCE:

Thank You to the many parents who contact the school either directly or through UEducateUs to explain their child's absence. The school has a duty of care to ensure that absences are explained. Ashleigh will be managing Attendance records, working on these each Wednesday. If your child has an unexplained absence, you may be contacted through UEducateUs, directly by email or a phone call from Ashleigh. If you receive communication from school about an absence which doesn't make sense, please contact the school and we will sort this out.

The department of education is frequently checking up on high absence and so having information helps us keep them informed.

CSEF: This stands for Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund. To be eligible for the \$150 for each child, paid into your school account, 'a parent or legal guardian MUST be the holder of an eligible Centrelink Health Care Card, Pensioner Concession Card or holder of a Veterans Affairs Gold Card'. Families who are eligible and have accessed it last year, please check that you are still eligible. These families will be automatically rolled over. Please see Andrea if you are a new parent and feel you are eligible.

Parents of students in Grade 1-6 will receive enrolment details we currently have on record. It is very important that we have up-to-date details in case of an emergency. When you receive this in the next week or so, please check carefully and return, signed with any amendments. Senior Class News

With our last swimming lesson day on Monday it has been fantastic to see growth in every student's swimming skills and abilities! Well done to all! It is also now lovely to be back in the classroom to re-establish a normal routine. Students have done this quite well already this week and have shown that they are eager to learn.

All senior students have been given their 'DO-IT' diaries in a clear folder along with a 'good-fit' book that they have chosen. These are our home reading folders. Senior students are expected to read at home 4 nights a week, write these in their diary and get the week signed off by a parent/guardian. Our home reading folders are due back *every Monday*, where I will check in with your student and sign their diary. Students who read more than the 4 nights a week will earn extra Dojo points for each day extra they do!

In class we have continued working on our narrative writing pieces and focusing on putting quality time into planning our stories. In mathematics we have continued our focus on place value and understanding that we are all mathematicians in our own ways! Students in grades 5 and 6 are continuing to work on their school leadership position applications and are doing a fantastic job!




