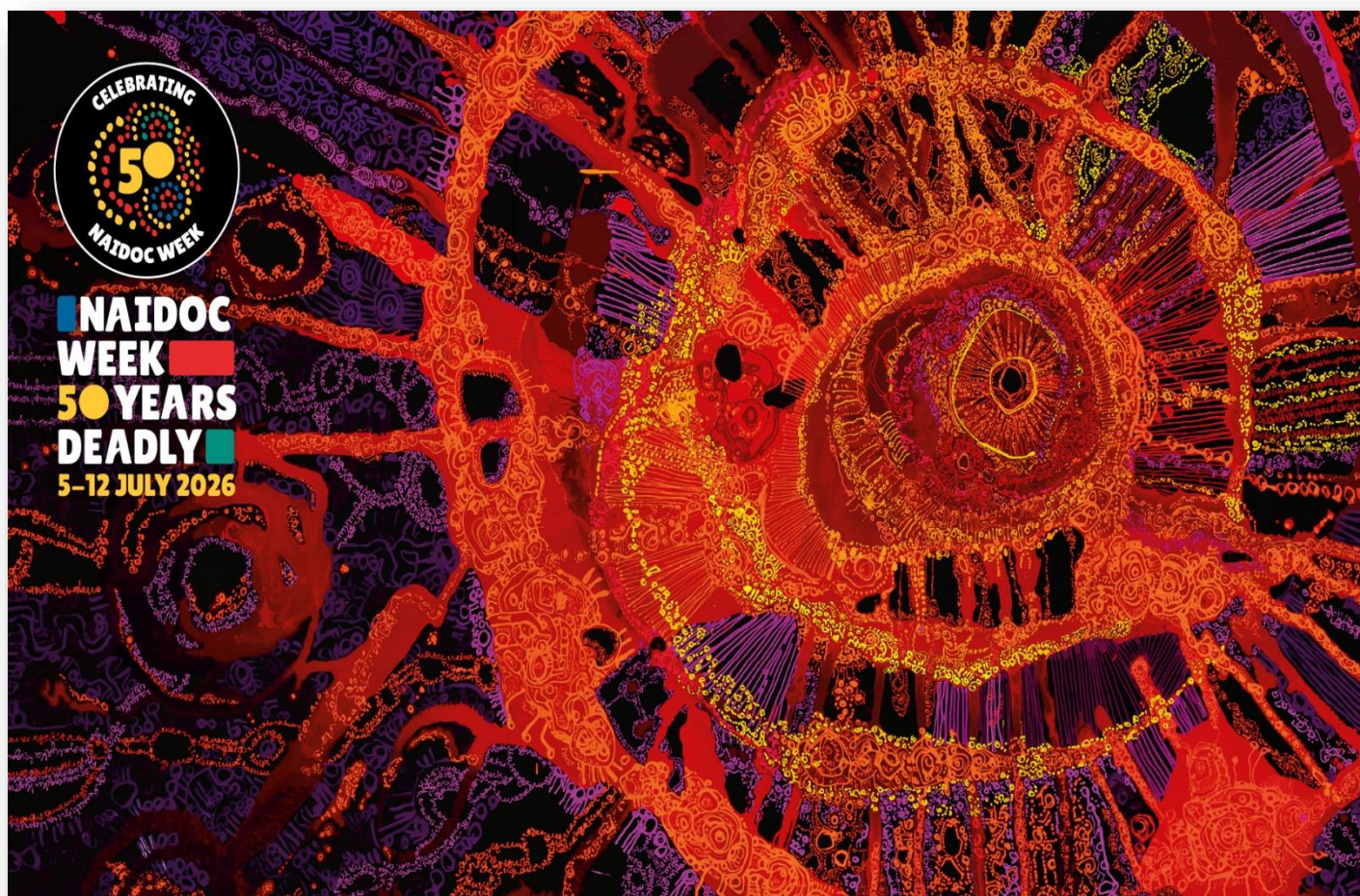
Winter Concert

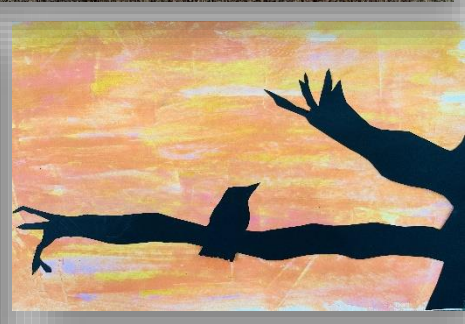
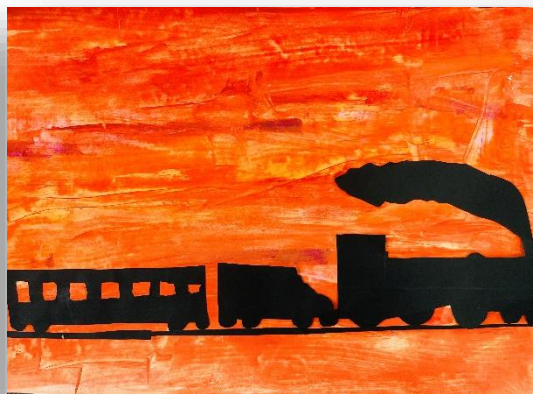

Art News – Lou Cooper



Senior students have been creating some amazing silhouette artworks. They first did a paint scrape background of their own chosen colours. They then created a picture or story of their choice drawing an outline on black paper then carefully cutting it out to create a silhouette.



Foundation students have been creating “woolly monsters”. They first watched “the colour monster” story book then drew and painted a monster shape. Week 2 the students did a wool wrap, pipe-cleaner arms and legs, google eye/s, teeth and of course- a bit of bling!



Learning in the Junior School

Over the last few weeks, Junior School Students have been learning about procedures. They have analysed procedures and found features that they have in common. They have learnt about the importance of verbs when explaining the method, and have been practising making their own procedural texts.

Last week, students were challenged to follow and reproduce a procedure just by watching and listening. Making fairy bread is not for the faint of heart, and students in the Junior School certainly rose to the occasion! Following the example, they made their own fairy bread, explaining the actions they were doing and why. This culminated in the delightful and delicious duty of devouring their delectable delicacies.

Participation

We're sitting these competitions via the AMT competition platform which means personal information about your child, including their first and last name, date of birth, gender, school and school year will be recorded in AMT's online platform.

AMT also publish the results of its competitions and activities on its website, which may include information such as the student's name, school, school year, state, award and score as well as the names of award winners and/or medalists.

AMT has advised that the personal information is kept in their competition servers which are physically located in Australia, however they use an online provider platform based in the Netherlands for competition processing and analysis. Back-up servers are located in the Netherlands. AMT deliver the competitions, and use the personal information, in accordance with the AMT's Privacy Policy. FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

INFORMATION FOR FAMILIES

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's financial circumstances and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS and EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school excursions, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or support an out of home care student you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid directly to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is \$400 for all school students.

HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from the website below.

If you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- **new student enrolments:** your child has started or changed schools this year.
- **changed family circumstances:** such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.
