
Please remember to Pack your hat.

We are almost into October and that means we will be inviting students and adults to join our Inktober

Inktober is a month-long global art challenge in October where participants create and share an ink drawing each day. Participants can follow the official daily prompts or create their own subjects, and the challenge can be adapted to different styles, including digital ink, markers, or watercolours. It's a creative smorgasbord!

The Inktober challenge has several aims including:

- Improving skills no matter what skill level you are
- Developing and boosting creativity
- Building consistency and discipline by keeping at the task every day for thirty one days
- Challenging ourselves to think about how to represent the prompts and how to adapt our skills to best suit our ideas.

It's a fun and flexible way for artists of all skill levels to grow and have a new creative experience.

This is our second year joining the challenge and students from all levels are invited to be part of the challenge. It is not compulsory.

With this newsletter you will find a copy of the calendar which contains the global prompts for this year. Feel free to print this at your convenience. Copies will also be available from the front office and students will have the opportunity to take a copy at the end of their art session this week. Hold on to the sheet and be ready to start on the first day of October and end on the 31st.

All those who choose to join the challenge and who return their completed sheet by Thursday 6 November will be awarded a small prize. Three works will be selected from each class for an additional prize. The drawings must be the work of the person named on the returned sheet to be eligible for the additional prize.

Adults are most welcome to join our challenge.





VISION

SEE THE SYMPTOMS, FIND THE PROBLEM

An eye examination with an Optometrist is recommended for all school age children. It takes approximately 25 minutes and attracts a Medicare rebate- no referral is required.

Children who are struggling with undetected vision problems often fail to progress well in school. You can use the following checklist to look for the common symptoms that children with vision problems exhibit.

One eye turns in or out while the other points straight ahead. Frequent blinking & red or watery eyes.

Difficulty concentrating or covering or closing one eye.

Holding a book very close to read & squinting or sitting very close when watching TV.

Complaints of headaches blurred or double vision.

If your child displays any of these symptoms, we suggest that you visit or contact your local Optometrist as soon as

INFORMATION FOR PARENTS The

Primary School Nursing Program is a free service offered by the Department of Education and Training.
Your child will receive a link to the School Entrant Health Questionnaire in their first year at school-please complete this form online and return it to school as soon as possible (hard copies available on request)

If you do not wish for your child to be seen simply click the 'no' box, in the consent are of the online questionnaire. The information in the questionnaire is confidential & helps the Primary School Nurse understand any concerns you may have about your child's health & development & the impact this may have on their learning. This information is important in providing support for you & your child. If your child need's a brief further assessment such as a vision or hearing test the nurse will see them at school.

You can contact the nurse directly if you wish to discuss the screening which may include checking your child's distance vision, hearing, speech and oral health. The nurse is also available to parents to discuss on any concerns with parenting and child health & wellbeing issues.

ORAL HEALTH

Regular dental check-ups (6-12monthly) are recommended as part of your child's dental health routine. Healthy teeth and gums are vital to your school-age child's general health. Dental care for children's teeth starts with cleaning your child's teeth twice a day.

Your child may be eligible for the Commonwealth Child Dental Benefits Schedule, which provides \$1000 worth of basic dental care over a 2 year period for eligible children.
