This week in literacy students will be completing a choice activity relating to our mentor text *Lighthouse Blues* by Paul Jennings that we finished last week. Students will also be finalising the publishing of their persuasive text <u>All School Students Should Get A School Camp</u> and accompanying reflection on Coonawarra Camp.

Teachers will be continuing to assess reading as students work independently on these tasks.

In maths we will be studying angles and transformations. This is a great unit where students get to both define and measure angles that we see (but maybe don't notice) in our environment every day.

In science students will be relating the location of their island to the climate in which it is found and using this to define the types of vegetation they might find on their island.

We are encouraging all students to continue to work towards achieving at least 3 nights during the week. Please support your child in achieving this goal.

Hello Grade 5/6 families

Students of the week are:

**Willow Douglas:** For an improvement in her reader's responses. Willow is now writing in more detail and thinking about what she reads on a deeper level.

**Max Friend and Zach Seaton:** For collaborating with each other to discuss their literature circle books to gain a deeper understanding of their reading.

In reading we have recently finished our mentor text "Ask No Questions" which was a memoir about a woman who immigrated from Poland to Australia after WW 2. The book was written in verse. The students have been



discussing what they have learnt about immigration, the cold war and communism and whether they enjoyed reading a book of poetry and how effective they thought it was.

In writing students are finishing their planet research and presenting their information in an interesting and informative manner. Students will present their information to the class.

In maths we will be focussing on negative numbers and their real world uses as well and chance and probability. Students have also enjoyed designing a "Gaga Ball" game for our school. They have been looking at elements such as safety, size, materials and costs to make this game.


