

Hello 3/4 students and families!

- Identifying main idea in reading passages and using the information provided in passages to answer questions;



Recording figurative language from books we are reading (a great home discussion activity too! The children have loved our focus on different forms of figurative language and it is great if they can have discussions with those at home about phrases too!)

MATHS -

- Addition using our knowledge and understanding of place value and the friends of ten;
- Building fluency in making ten and bridging to the next 10;
- Finding efficient ways to add larger numbers.

INTEGRATED STUDIES - Developing our Learning Culture

Understanding, recognising and using social skills to assist each other to learn.

Hi Year 5/6 families.

This week in reading we are focusing on how characters and locations within a text connect to the story and overall theme. We will continue our mentor text 'Call it Courage' and explore the many themes and big ideas explored in the story. In writing students improving their writing by honing their editing skills (particularly using correct punctuation). We are also developing our revising skills, with a focus on varying the length of sentences and further developing an idea within a narrative. In maths, we are building number fluency within addition and transferring simple addition skills to more complex problems.

Students in Year 5 will be beginning NAPLAN on Wednesday. NAPLAN reading is on Wednesday and writing is on Thursday. The rest will be completed next week (Tuesday/Wednesday).

For our Wednesday sports rotations, the students who are on Bike Ed this week (and are required to bring their bike and helmet) are: Keanu, George, Jackson, Zeppelin, Chelsea, TJ, Reef, Ollie, Arlia, Summer, Storm, Oceanna and Tahlia.
