

In reading this week students will be working through a literacy contract and select a task a day to complete using their lit circles text, our mentor text; Pannikin and Pinta or a nonfiction text. We are continuing to focus on paraphrasing non-fiction texts. Students will be taught to read a text, select synonyms for key words and rewrite the information in their own words, in a way that reflects their understanding of the text. In writing, students are learning about the features of information reports, researching and planning their own information report. In mathematics, we are learning about financial maths, particularly finding change, and developing efficient strategies to total money.

Don't forget the family Fun Night this Friday from 5-7 pm. Just a reminder that students need to be supervised by a parent. Bring along a picnic dinner or buy a sausage from the BBQ on the night.

FRENCH

Bonjour,

This week at assembly, **Casey Bills** received an award for his impressive listening skills and use of solving strategies to match the questions to the correct answers in French. He was also a fantastic helper to one of his classmates, supporting him to write his description of himself.

Emily Whelan also received an award for taking ownership of her learning. Without prompting, she wrote the new words that were being introduced in her French book. This attitude, often seen in higher grades, reflects her sense of responsibility in the French classroom, always giving her best.

Students in 1/2 continue to review colours to describe clothes. They will have to think about word order as, in French, the colour comes after the clothes. They will also have to review the concept of masculine and feminine. Colour adjectives will look different depending on the gender of the word. Though they are not expected to know how to apply the rules at this level, I would like them to show that they notice the gender of the colour by looking at the word.

Grades 3 and 4 students will be working on their final copy or their song and will be presenting it to their classmates. We'll review giving our opinion on sports and hobbies with a little group competition.

5/6 students will have the challenge to listen to a native speaker talk about her hometown. They will then be given the option to describe their own hometown or to create their ideal town and describe it.


ART
