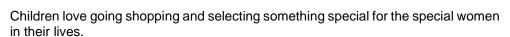

Good morning all, I hope everyone is enjoying the fresh mornings. Congratulations to award winners this week Max Thomson for his persistence, it's great to see him try and try again. Evie Jackson for her attitude towards her learning and never shying away from a challenge.



This week we are looking at:

Reading

- Making Predictions as we read- we are using what we know about the book and any connections we have, to help us think about what will happen next.
- We are focusing on the letter j, w, z looking at both name and sound while revising the other letters we have already looked at.

Writing

- We are exploring sound placement in words. This will help us to segment and blend larger words accurately.
- Simple sentences, making sure they are well structured and have a capital and full stop.
- Handwriting how the letters sit on the line.

Maths:

- We are looking at number lines and how they work. We will be using them with addition and subtraction
- Counting on we are looking at why this skill is important and how we can use it with other addition and subtraction strategies.

Integrated studies:

Students are looking at communities and where they fit into them. This week is all about their family community.

This week in reading, we are finishing up our work on making predictions before, during and after reading by framing our thinking using the prompts 'I think... because...'.

In maths we are exploring a range of strategies to help us when adding and subtracting numbers. We hope that by practising these strategies and using a range of tools that students will be able to develop the cognitive skills to solve problems in their head, rather than by using their fingers.

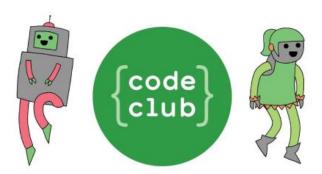
