#### Last Week's Fun!



#### Take home Readers.

Please remember that <u>take home readers</u> need to come back to school <u>every day,</u> so students can swap over their books and get a reading star. We are aiming to get a reading start every day this week.

#### Library

We go to the library every Friday so on these days students can chooses a new library book if they have returned their previous one. Library book get returned every Friday.

#### This week we are looking at:

#### Reading:

- We are building a range of reading strategies, such as doing picture walks to get our minds ready and getting our mouth ready to predict words.
- The Prep's are focusing on recognising the letters n & d and matching them to their sounds.
- The grade ones are focusing on the sound 'ng'.
- We are looking at the Rosie's Walk, focusing on the words Pat Hutchins used and why.

#### Writing:

- Segmenting CVC words

   this is when you break apart the sounds you hear in short three sound word and
  write the sounds you hear.
- The grade ones are listening to the blends they hear in words, segmenting CCVC words.
- Building sentence structure so students can start to write their own simple sentences.

#### Maths

The Preps are continuing to look at the friends of ten (two numbers we can put together to make ten) as well as comparing larger and smaller numbers.



Grade Ones are using greater than and smaller than symbols to compare larger numbers as well as using place value to make different numbers.

This week in reading we are beginning to look at visualising and how we can 'make a movie in our head' whilst we read.

In Writing, we will continue to look closely at the words used in Big Rain Coming to help us sequence our own story where the characters are anticipating something exciting happening.

In Maths we are working on our place value skills through use of the hundreds chart and exploring numbers that are 1 more, 1 less, 10 more and 10 less.

This week in 3/4

The grade 3 students are starting Naplan testing this week. The grade 4 students will be working with Mrs Mackie, whilst the Grade 3 are completing Naplan.

In reading we will continue to study our mentor text *The Bugalugs Bum Thief* and using this book to practise making connections as we read.

In Maths we will continue our focus on place value, building our understanding of place value and how to represent numbers on a number line.

In Science this week we are continuing our chemical science unit focusing on changing states of matter. Students will be conducting an experiment to see what happens when heat is applied to a range of materials.

Grade 3/4 and some senior students entered paintings and craft in the Orbost show and it was great to see their work on display.

#### 5/6

Hi Year 5/6 families

We hope everyone enjoyed their long weekend. A big well done to Gracie, Jake and Ray competing in the divisional swimming carnival. They proudly represented our school. This week the Year 5's begin NAPLAN assessments. It starts on Wednesday with the writing test. There are three assessments this week and one the following week.

In reading, we are continuing our focus on summarising and vocabulary. Some ways that students are practising these strategies are using plot mountains, writes chapter summaries and finding synonyms for the meaning of words. Literature circles are going fantastically, with students bringing a lot of ideas to the weekly discussions. Students may bring home their literature circle book or task to ensure they are ready for their literature circle discussion. In writing, students are completing their personal memoirs and writing short stories. In mathematics, we are continuing to work on number fluency for a range of operations and skills.



Last week we began our science unit, focusing on chemical science. Students are investigating solids, liquids and gases, and how/when they change.






