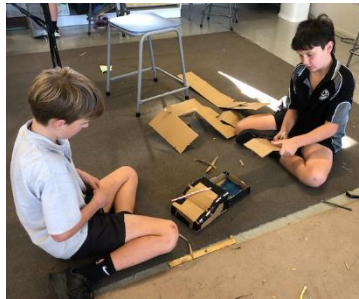
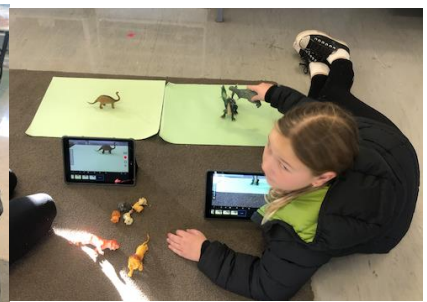

Zoe Nairn-so impressed with your focus and determination in Athletics training. Your technique across the events is getting better and better and you know how to give everything your 100% best effort.

Maddy Angel-fantastic growth mindset in our Athletics training, I loved how you applied your new knowledge, especially in High Jump, and it's great to see you do hard things!

Coen Buck-Roberts-I have enjoyed seeing you progress, embrace feedback and try new things in Athletics to improve your performance, well done!

It's been a lot of fun challenging ourselves with a growth mindset, improving our physical skills and practising pro-social collaboration in PE this semester. Prep to Grade 2s have worked on moving safely on different surfaces; listening for the whistle to stop; and playing tag games carefully. They have practised "running their safest, not their fastest" on grass and the basketball court; looking where they are going so they don't crash into others and being gentle taggers in minor games. Students have developed their fundamental motor skills of running, dodging, hopping, jump rope skipping and jumping; ball handling such as rolling, bouncing, throwing and catching; and introductory gymnastic activities, such as animal walks, rolling, balancing and safe landings.

Grade 3-6 students have had the opportunity to train and practice their physical skills and fitness for swimming, cross country and athletics this semester. We have completed all of the TAPS carnivals for the year and Senior students have also successfully competed in the District Winter Sports Carnival in soccer and netball. It has been a very busy semester!

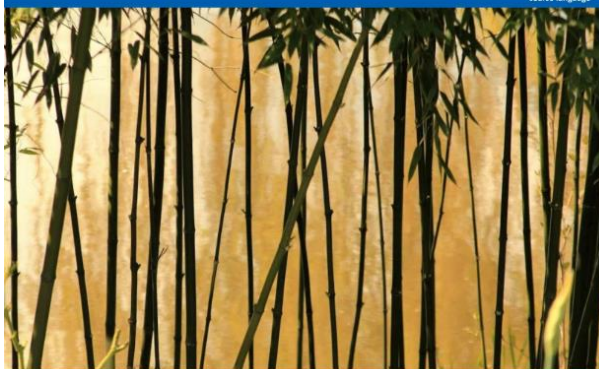
