Hope everyone has a great week and always happy to have a chat with anyone if they have a concern. Take care.



Respectful Relationships: For the next few weeks, we will be exploring positive gender relationships. This week we are talking about how all students regardless of gender can play in a fair, inclusive and friendly way. Students will also identify the emotions people can have when others are being mean or violent.

Hello everyone and welcome to week 9 of Term 4!

This week in reading, we are revisiting visualising through drawing and acting out various parts of the short stories we have been reading in 'Stories for 8-year olds'.

In writing, we are continuing our exploration of writing persuasively. Students have enjoyed writing a letter to their audience to try and convince them of something that they want. Students are now enjoying typing these.

In maths, we are exploring mass and capacity and comparing how much different items weigh/hold.

This week, both classes will focus on positive gender relations through the Resilience, Rights, and Respectful Relationships program. This topic is about understanding gender-based violence, including unfair and hurtful behaviours. This week and next week in particular students will be learning about consent, which parts of their body are kept more private than others and the importance of personal space and keeping their bodies safe. We encourage you to have a chat with your child about what strategies they can use to help themselves. Should you have any queries about this unit of the program, please get in touch for a chat.

Finally, we have our Bollywood Extravaganza on Thursday night. Students are super excited to show you, their dancing. It would be awesome if you could help your child find some clothes to go with their class theme (please don't go out and buy anything new).

Grade 1/2A students should wear water colours (like blues, aquas and greens). Grade 1/2B students should wear white, with colourful colours as decoration.

This week the focus will be on Bollywood! This is our fabulous Artist-in-Residence for the year and time when students get to learn, practise and have fun performing. 
Art



year. The primary goal is to assess aerobic capacity, which is the body's ability to use oxygen to sustain endurance performance. We have been discussing how our personal fitness can make us feel good, change our mood, protect our bones as we grow, and over time help protect our health and wellbeing over our life.
