Parent opinion survey

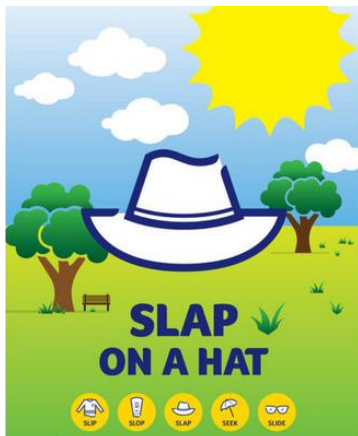

Thank you to everyone who attended this year's writer's festival; it was a great turnout, and we were very proud of our students' stories.

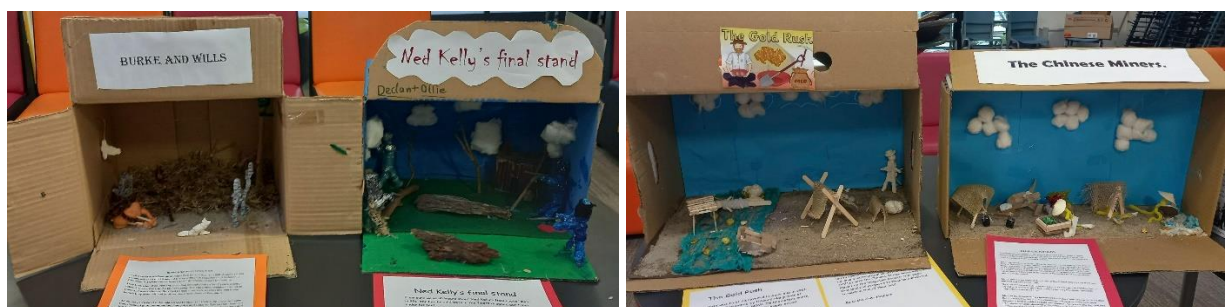
In literacy this week, students will continue to write reading responses for *Tigg and the Bandicoot Bushranger* and their Lit Circle text.

In writing, we will be finishing off and publishing stories they have been working on during the term.

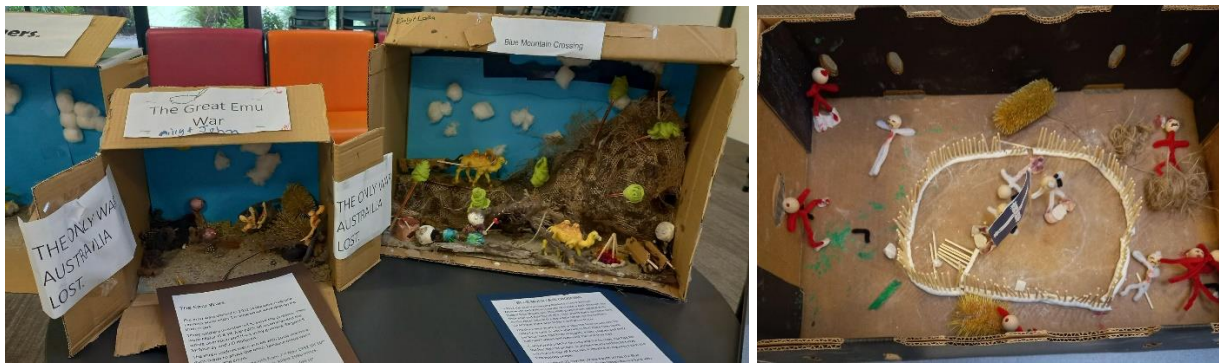
This week in maths, we are concluding our unit on decimals, fractions and percentages and finishing our time board games. We are looking forward to testing and playing each other's games on Thursday.

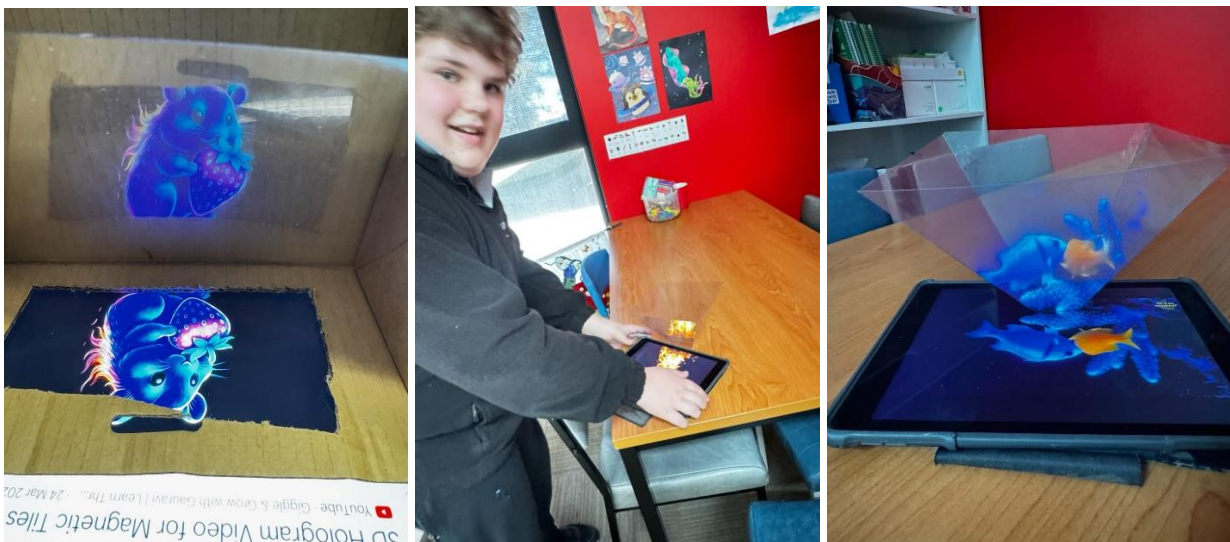

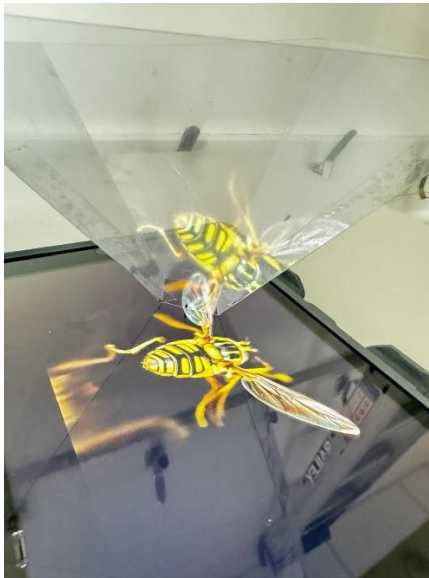

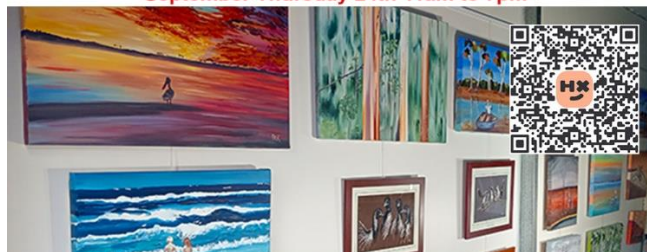
