Next Week

As it is the last week of term, we have a few things happening:

- Wednesday - harmony day colour run. Students need to wear a white T-Shirt for the run. Parents are welcome to come and help throw colours, hand out ice-poles or just watch. We will be starting at 1:45pm.
- Thursday - last day of term, early finish at 2:15

This week we are looking at:

Reading:

- Students are engaging with a mentor text, with a focus on developing foundational comprehension skills (G.K.R) and exploring how sentence structure can build understanding and create suspense within a narrative.
- Students are working within differentiated spelling groups tailored to their individual learning needs. These groups focus on skills including consonant-vowel-consonant (CVC) patterns, digraphs, blends, and long vowel sounds.
- Prep students will be introduced to a new set of letters: *m, d, g, o, c, and f*.

Writing:

- Prep students are writing simple sentences using CVC words, with a focus on using initial sounds and leaving appropriate spaces between words.
- Year 1 students are learning how to add detail to their sentences to make their writing more engaging and descriptive.
- Year 1/2 students are revising their understanding of full stops and capital letters.
- All students are focusing on developing neat and consistent handwriting across all forms of writing.

Maths:

This week in Maths, students are exploring pattern:

- identifying the repeating elements within patterns and determining missing elements.
- Finding the rule in additive patterns that can be increasing or decreasing.

Students will also continue developing their understanding of place value.

- Prep students are consolidating their ability to order numbers to 10 in a variety of sequences.
- Year 1 students are applying their knowledge of tens and ones to identify numbers that are 10 more and 10 less.
- Two's are looking at standard and non-standard groupings to make numbers.




