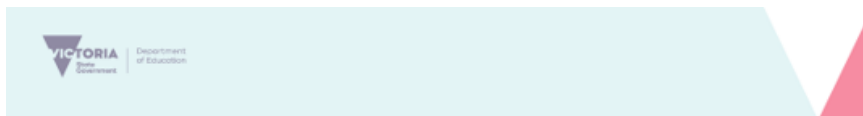

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

INFORMATION FOR FAMILIES

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund help ensure that no student will miss the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational, and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's financial circumstances and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS and EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline, and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school excursions, camps, and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or support an out of home care student, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid directly to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions, or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is \$400 for all school students.

HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from the website below.

If you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- **new student enrolments:** your child has started or changed schools this year.
- **changed family circumstances:** such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.

It has been a busy week in the junior area with the hockey roadshow and maths-related Winter Olympics events!



We have an open-door policy so feel free to come see us for any reason and we greatly appreciate parent helpers during reading, so if you have a free morning please come and listen to our class read, no warning needed.

Wednesdays

Just a reminder that the Preps have Wednesdays off and have been allocated a specific time to come in to do a one-on-one session, focusing on the English and Math activities.

It is an opportunity that allows us to find their level of understanding and skills so we can create appropriate programs for their abilities.

This week we are looking at:

Reading:

- Students are revising and learning different reading strategies such as vocabulary, making inferences, questioning, summarising and reading aloud.
- Students are working within their spelling groups based on their needs.

Writing:

- Preps are practicing their names and directionality using the line.
- 1/2's are learning to write a recount using correct time markers such as first, then, next and finally, to add detail and expand on their ideas, and to finish with how they felt about the experience they are recounting.
- Continued practice writing the 'who, what doing and where' components of a sentence for our preps and extending the 1/2's with 'when' and 'how'
- Handwriting s, a, t

Maths:

This week in maths, the P/1/2's are celebrating the Winter Olympics by hosting their own mini-Olympics consisting of speed skating (with socks on slippery floor) with a side event of figure skating, cotton ball curling,

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and cardboard box bobsledding! Events will take place over the next three days with tallying of points at the end of each day's events. Friday will be our main tally and graphing day when we find out which country won the most points overall. We welcome families to join us in the festivities to be held at the LTB Hall and the P/1/2 classrooms on Wednesday and Thursday at 11:30 - 12:30.

Integrated Studies

- Exploring different emotions and body language.
- Preps will be spending time with their grade 6's to find their buddies.

Reading

Our home reading is now up and running and our new take home book covers have finally arrived. Please complete the reading record form and sign it each time your child reads at home. Readers need to be brought to school every day, so we can keep a check of home reading and change take home books.

Please feel free to come and help with reading if you have a spare morning. Monday- straight after assembly, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday- 9:00-9:15am (not Tuesday mornings as we have specialists).

In reading we have introduced CAFÉ reading where children are given strategies in comprehension, fluency, accuracy and vocabulary which they can use to help them improve their reading. They are loving our mentor text "A Good Tip for Ghosts".

Maths

We have begun the year with a unit on place value which involves reading and writing larger numbers (to thousands and higher) manipulating numbers e.g. 562 is 5 hundreds+6 tens +2 units or 4 hundreds +16 tens +2 units. We will also be adding and subtracting 10's, 100's and 1000's to larger numbers.

We are lucky to have Mrs Plant working with us for maths which means we can work with smaller groups and really target the specific needs of children, extending and supporting where needed.

On Monday morning all grade 3/4 students had fun participating in a hockey clinic. If students are interested in playing hockey they received an information pamphlet for the club at Swan Reach.

This week, in reading, we will be introducing our Mentor Text, *Sister Heart* by Sally Morgan. Our focus is vocabulary, and students are learning to work out the meaning of unfamiliar words by using the context of the text and thinking of synonyms for the word. We are also considering author purpose and using questioning to determine if the piece has been written to persuade, inform, describe or entertain.

In writing, we are focusing on planning our ideas prior to writing and exploring ways to engage the reader through "Sizzling Starts!" Students started decorating and personalising their writer's notebooks last week, and we'll finish that this week. They are looking great!

In maths this week, we will continue to focus on decimal fractions. Students will complete a range of activities and games to support their understanding of decimals and how to compare sizes of fractions and decimals using the place value system.

Our grade 5 students will be practising their typing skills in preparation for NAPLAN. If students have an opportunity to practice typing at home too, that will be a great benefit to them during the NAPLAN test period.

The grade 6 students had their first buddy session last Friday and enjoyed getting to know the preps. It was a great success; the grade 6 students certainly enjoyed the opportunity to dress up and have fun with the younger children. Grade 5 students teamed up with the grade ones from Prep/1, playing games and developing the sportsmanship.

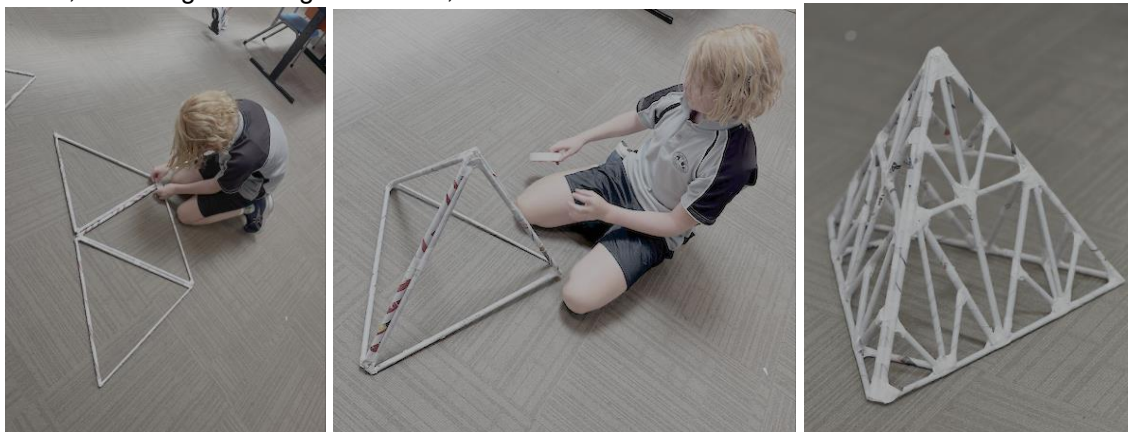

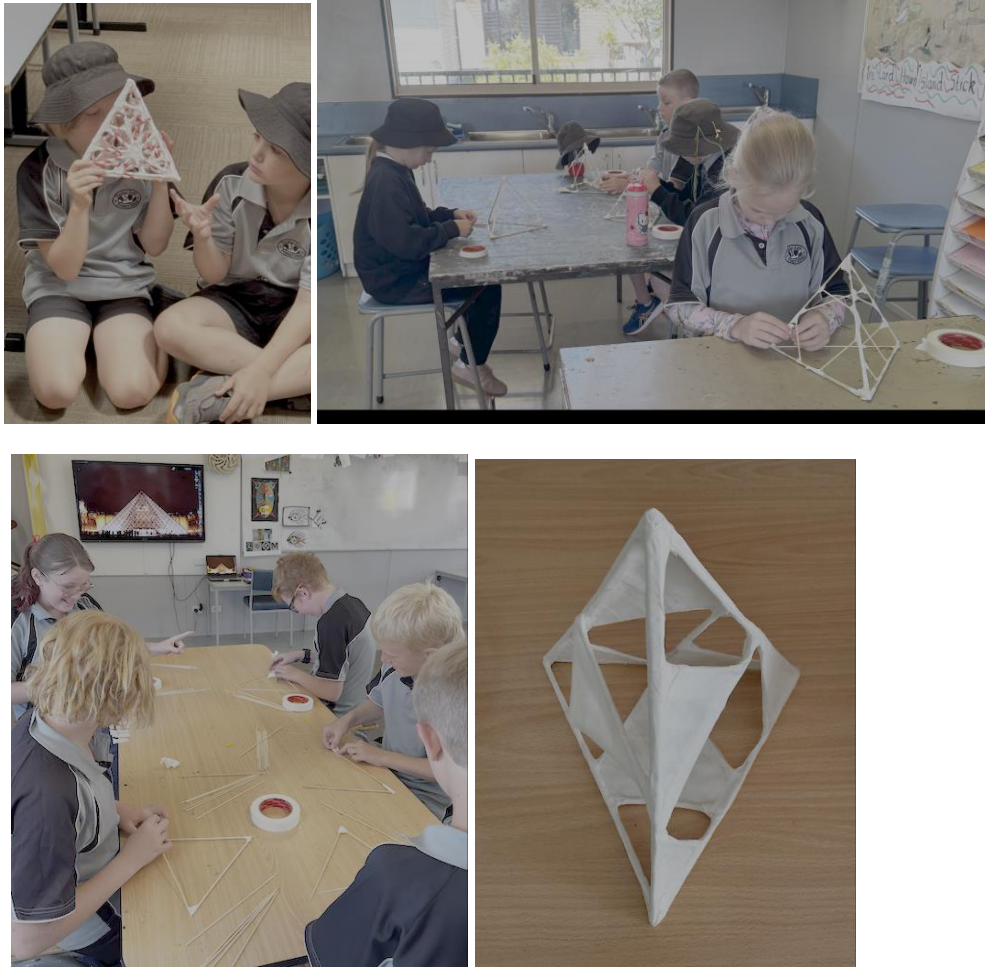


