This week we are looking at:

Reading

- We are starting our AL book Handa's Surprise. We will be exploring picture information, authors word choice and sentence structure to help us read with growing fluency.
- Vocabulary for the next few weeks we will be looking at word meaning and how they add addition information to our stories and help build our visualisation.

Writing

- This term we are looking at narratives and their structure. We will be continuing to build our idea, creating a
 start which include who, where and when, middle that's include what the characters are doing to make the
 story interesting and a solution and an ending.
- Students will be focusing on the secretarial aspects of writing, revising where to place a full stop and capital letter to make their stories flow.
- In spelling students are working on a range of different activities for building CVC words, rhyming, syllable work, blends and diagraphs. Students are separated into groups and working at their skill level.

Maths:

This term, we're diving into Addition and Subtraction. This week we are concluding out addition skills but using counting on strategies and strategic thinking to find all the solutions to an open-ended question. Have a great week,

Hello everyone and welcome to week 4 of term 3!

Awards this week in 1/2A went to **Halle Douglas** and **Jayce Parsons**. Halle's was for her effort towards her reading and the progress she is making, always taking on feedback to improve. Jayce's award was for his improved effort towards his writing, writing the most amount that he has ever written. In 1/2B awards went to **Casey Bills** and **Hannah Wickham** for the collaboration when doing their challenging task.

This week in reading, we are reading a range of different books with a focus on questioning whilst we read to deepen our understanding of the text.

In writing this week, we will be finishing our pieces for the Writer's Festival, as well as practising writing detailed middles to our stories by building the tension up to eventually solve a problem.

In maths, we are continuing to explore multiplication and repeated addition by exploring the link between groups of and arrays to help us describe basic multiplication facts by discussing rows and columns.

In spelling this term, we are continuing to adjust our spelling groups based on the individual spelling needs of students. Students are either working on consonants, digraphs, blends and short vowels, long vowels or other vowel sounds.

Both classes will focus on help-seeking strategies through the Resilience, Rights, and Respectful Relationships program. We encourage you to have a chat with your child about what strategies they can use to help them help themselves.

Through our history unit, we will continue exploring the concepts of past, present and future. We continue to explore this in our session on Friday.

In Reading this week, we are continuing to explore non-fiction texts. The classes will be swapping over mentor texts so that 3/4A can explore *What is a Fish?* And 3/4B can learn about *Animal Shelters*. Our focus will be identifying and using text features.

Students will continue to research their chosen animal for their information report. We hope to start organising our collected information and to start drafting our introduction.

In Maths this week, we are continuing to explore fractions, with a focus on identifying equivalents. Please take any opportunity to talk about fractions in the real world at home (What fraction of your sandwich did you eat today? Can you cut the pizza into quarters?)

Last week students had a science challenge which required them to use their understanding of friction to get a tennis ball and a sneaker to travel down the slide at same speed. Well done to all students for their collaboration. persistence and participation in this great activity. The winners were: John, Katarlis and Sienna, and Logan, Emily and Travis. Both of these groups scored a 10/10 when their two objects arrived at the end of the slide together. Tomorrow, the 3/4 unit will be participating in a cricket clinic in the morning. Hello Grade 5/6 Families

Students of the week are:

In writing we are learning how to write persuasive texts. We have looked at the features of a persuasive paragraph and what makes a good introduction. Students have been writing on the topic "Sixteen Year Olds Are Too Young to Vote" and next they will have the opportunity to choose their own topic.

In reading, students are continuing to complete activities such as character studies and answering comprehension questions which relate to their particular book.

In maths we are continuing our focus on fractions and decimals with an emphasis on multiplying and dividing by 10's and comparing fractions.

In our inquiry unit we are looking at how bills are introduced into parliament and how they can be made into laws.

This week our grade 5/6 students are participating in the "Youth on Purpose" program. On Monday Chico Johnson who is running the program treated students to a performance of songs with strong messages about believing in yourself and being positive. He had everyone up dancing. Chico will continue working with students on Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday. During this time students will be having a go at writing their own songs and talking about community and resilience.

I loved how Mannix knew what to do to improve and chose to challenge himself.




