This week we are looking at:

Reading

- We are starting our AL book *Handa's Surprise*. We will be exploring picture information, authors word choice and sentence structure to help us read with growing fluency.
- Vocabulary for the next few weeks we will be looking at word meaning and how they add addition information to our stories and help build our visualisation.

Writing

- This term we are looking at narratives and their structure. We will be continuing to build our idea, creating a start which include who, where and when, middle that's include what the characters are doing to make the story interesting and a solution and an ending.
- Students will be focusing on the secretarial aspects of writing, revising where to place a full stop and capital letter to make their stories flow.
- In spelling students are working on a range of different activities for building CVC words, rhyming, syllable work, blends and diagraphs. Student are separated into groups and working at their skill level.

Maths:

This term, we're diving into Subtraction, focusing on starting from the bigger number and making it smaller while looking at the language we would hear such as minus, take away, less, fewer and difference.

Hello everyone and welcome to week 7 of term 3!

Awards this week in 1/2A went to **Lutarnna Nicholas** for her reading, and **Grace Jackson** and **Mave Blank** for adding detail to their writing. Congratulations to these students.

This week in reading, we are reading a range of different books with a focus on vocabulary and will create a class word wall of interesting words.

In writing this week, we are learning to build tension and suspense in our stories to make the middle of the stories exciting to read.

In maths, we are continuing to explore multiplication with a focus on the idea of 'times as many'.

In spelling this term, we are continuing to adjust our spelling groups based on the individual spelling needs of students. Students are either working on consonants, digraphs, blends and short vowels, long vowels or other vowel sounds.

Both classes will focus on help-seeking strategies through the Resilience, Rights, and Respectful Relationships program. We encourage you to have a chat with your child about what strategies they can use to help them help themselves.

Through our history unit, we will continue exploring the concepts of past, present and future. We continue to explore this in our session on Friday.

We are all super excited to be travelling to Bairnsdale this Thursday to see the Gruffalo's Child at the Forge Theatre. We will also visit the Bairnsdale Library and the All-Abilities Playground whilst in town. To make it to the 10am show on time, we will be leaving school at 9am. Please remember to be at school at 8:45am so we can hop on the bus and on our way without delay.

This week in reading we will be looking at how to use pictures and diagrams in texts to support our understanding of what we are reading.

Students will begin drafting their information reports this week starting with a hook to get the reader interested. Our aim is to have these reports published by the end of term.

In Maths we are continuing to explore fractions, particularly equivalent fractions and using fractions in real life situations. On Thursdays, the two classes have been combining and completing thinking tasks. It has been really lovely to see students working in random small groups to find solutions to the given problems.

Last week in science students created balloon rockets to explore forces created by air. Congratulation to all kids for great collaboration and exploration. Hello Grade 5/6 Families Students of the week are:

Chloe Taylor: For using feedback to complete her literacy tasks to a higher standard.

Jasper Jonkers: For asking for help and completing more tasks to a higher standard as a result.

Flynn Whelan: For the efforts he has put into his persuasive writing. Great job following the TEEL structure. **Sam Davies:** For the positive way he approached all classroom tasks and the 5/6 incursion last week.

In writing children are choosing their own topic on which to write a persuasive text. Students have been planning and researching their arguments in order to write arguments that can be supported with examples and facts. In reading students have been listening to the mentor text "Call it Courage". Students researched an outrigger boat like the one used in our text. They planned and designed how they would make their own boat and proceeded to make a model based on their plan. Students had fun, putting effort into their design and seeing if their boat actually floated.

In maths we are continuing our focus on fractions and decimals with an emphasis on multiplying and adding decimals and comparing fractions.

In our inquiry unit we are continuing to look at how bills are introduced into parliament and how they can be made into laws. Students will show their understanding of this process by using their IT skills to design a flow chart which shows how a bill becomes a law.

Last week our grade 5/6 students participated in the "Youth on Purpose" program. **Chico Johnson** ran the program and talked to students about finding their purpose and how communities can work together to achieve their goals. Students then created their own songs, and most students were confident enough to perform them in front of their peers. This program provided inspiring messages in a fun way.

Ned and Jack's awards are pretty similar in the sense that they are both receiving it for their work on ordering the lyrics of our song. Jack was impressive and hardly needed any support to complete the task on his own. I was very proud of Ned for standing his ground during this activity. His classmates disagreed with him, but he respectfully and kindly explained his reasoning and he was right.

Zoe must be feeling so proud of herself. She worked so hard to learn her numbers to 100 and she has gained the confidence to do it in French now!

This week, Prep students will be reviewing their numbers to 20 and words for pets through songs, a treasure hunt, act it out and a listening test.

Students in grade 1-2 will sing our pet songs and we'll do a group rotation with activities such as act it out, colouring sheet on pets and colours and a listening test.

Students in grades 3 and 4 will practise talking about the sports they play in a short roleplay, and then they will start learning how to talk about other hobbies in French.

After setting their goals for learning, 5-6A will learn words to talk about money and where the Euro is used.




