WNC TURNING 40!

The Wonthaggi Neighbourhood Centre was officially opened back in January 1984. The establishment of the Centre was the culmination of much hard work by a committed and determined group of locals led by Lorraine and Ross Mitchell. With the assistance of a number of existing community based groups including the Apex Club, the Cape Paterson Progress Association and Life Saving club, and the support of the Borough of Wonthaggi Council, the vision began to take shape. The former station master's house was leased to become the hub of the Centre's Operations. The house was named in honour of Lorraine and Ross Mitchell, who both tragically died in a car accident in late 1982. The loss of the

Mitchell's was a significant setback for the group but they remained determined to realise the dream and ensure the Mitchell's legacy. Their collective efforts were realized when Mitchell House officially opened its doors as the Wonthaggi Neighbourhood Centre in January of 1984.

Since its opening the Centre has been and continues to be, a warm and welcoming place for a wide range of individuals, local groups and organisations. The Centre offers a broad range of activities including: lifelong learning, art and craft groups, health and well-being, family support, play groups, community advocacy, community event management and project development and the provision of a supportive and welcoming place for individuals and groups to meet.

Responding to local needs and issues, promoting community harmony principles and developing community strengthening practice has always been at the core of the Centre's purpose.

To mark the significant achievement of 40 years service the Neighbourhood Centre will be inviting members of the community to join in a birthday celebration to be held in Apex Park adjacent to Mitchell House in February next year. There will be music, kids entertainment and a free BBQ! Stay tuned for further information as the date draws nearer!

All members are welcome and encouraged to attend.

Meeting will include reports from the current President and Manager, a presentation of recent community survey results and election of office bearers for the next year.

The Wonthaggi Food Collective has been operating since its launch in December 2018. Those who have connected with the service through their membership of the Collective are benefitting from the savings made through this group approach to buying grocery items in bulk. The Collective purchases dry food items in bulk quantities and then distributes this to members at a small mark-up (no more than 25%) to cover the costs including for transportation of the ordered goods from the supplier in Lilydale to the Baw Baw Food Hub in Warragul where monthly pick ups take place.

The Collective is volunteer based and membership is steadily growing. Currently 28 members take advantage of the lower costs achieved through the process. Although there are some limits imposed by the number of volunteers and

available storage space, the Collective is certainly open to hearing from others who might be interested to learn more

and potentially consider membership in the future.

Group auspiced by the Neighbourhood Centre have been busy in recent time raising awareness within the community of the need that exists within the for food relief, general support services rental



advocacy, and especially more public housing. Local media including the Sentinal Times, The Waterline News, South Coast FM and WINTV, have all willingly responded to requests to report on the issues related to homelessness and include information presented by Housing Matters personnel. Such activity has served to emphasise the significant needs that exist locally, helped to raise the profile of the Housing Matters Group and most importantly, boosted awareness throughout the community. The Group has planned activities to mark Homelessness Awareness Week (Aug 7-13) and is currently working on a presentation to Bass Coast Shire focusing upon homelessness in the local area. Other activity includes the assessment of vacant land in the area for the potential placement of transitional/emergency housing units. Housing Matters Bass members are very willing to accept invitations to present on the issues and facilitate discussions from interested groups eg.
